Welcome to the Amazonian rainforest, a kingdom of rich, diverse colours, shapes, sounds, and smells.



Jungles, also known as tropical rainforests, occupy just a small part of our planet's surface but over one half of all animals and plants live in them. Focusing just on reptiles, you can find almost 400 reptilian species there. To life on Earth, jungles are simply indispensable.





Phew, it's quite tough for a person to force their way through the thick jungle! But winding tree roots, impassable bushes, lianas, and other dangerous obstacles are just the right thing for animals that need to shelter somewhere.

Millions of animals and plants can space out comfortably here; everyone uses the 'floor' they find the most suitable. Insects can be encountered above ground. Mammals like to hide in bushes. Branches are good for monkeys and birds.

There's an order to wilderness. Some creatures are adapted to hunting while others try not to become prey and stay perfectly inconspicuous. Tapirs, for example, like to lie low in muddy waters; their colouring assists them in this.

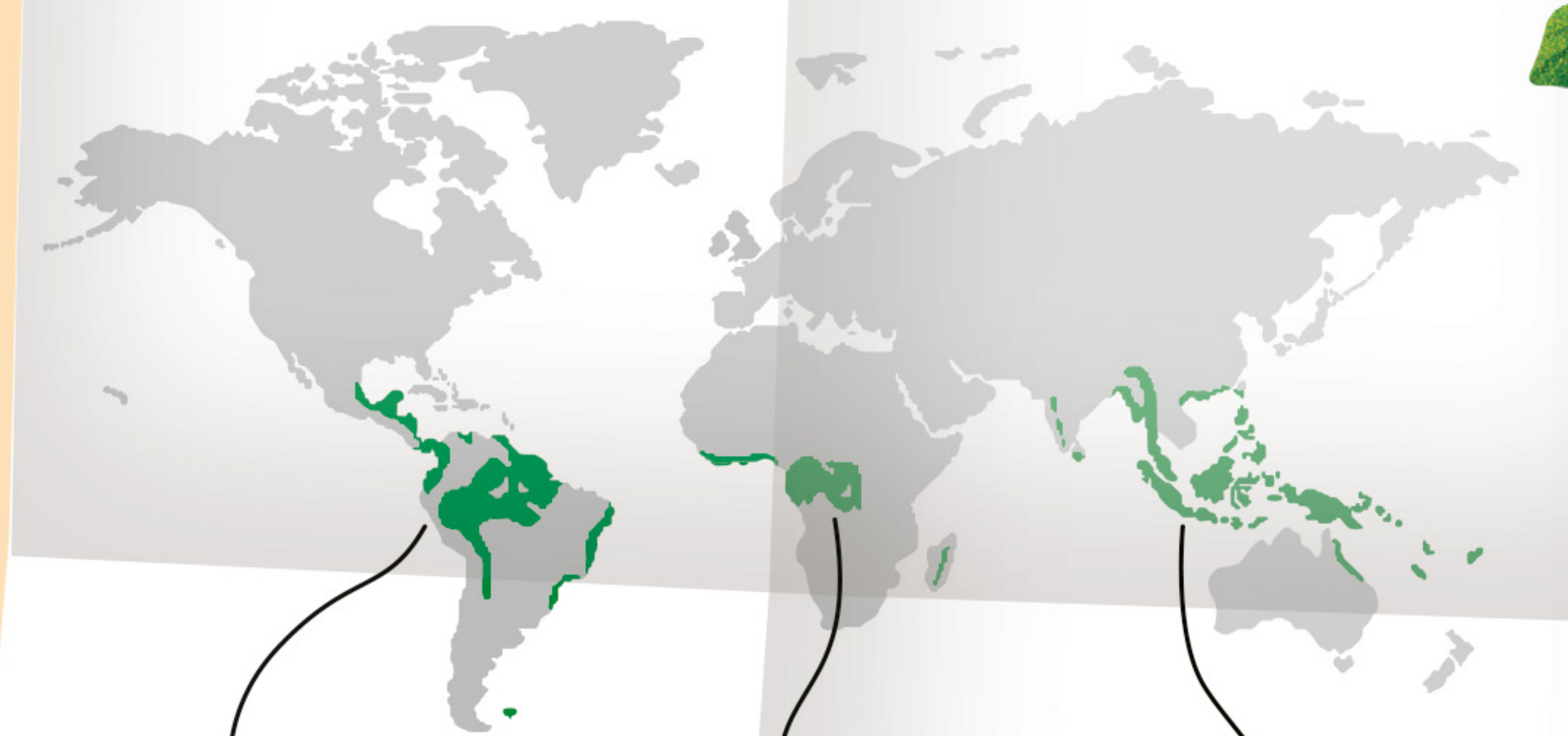
